ADRA UK RESPONDS TO THE SOUTH ASIA EARTHQUAKE DISASTER

The Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA-UK) based in Watford, has been actively involved in assisting thousands of people affected by the recent earthquake in South Asia. To help alleviate the suffering caused by this mega-disaster, ADRA is providing relief supplies including blankets, jerry cans for water, and emergency medicines to inhabitants of the Bagh district of Pakistan Administered Kashmir. ADRA-UK together with partner British charity, Blythswood Care, is putting together an airlift of bulk emergency supplies including blankets, sleeping bags, winterised tents and water purification tablets. An emergency ADRA medical team has been providing basic health services to the thousands of injured people immediately following the disaster.

In Pakistan the death toll is rising daily, and there is race against winter to provide supplies for the survivors. Conrad Vine, ADRA Pakistan acting director, highlighted the

extent of the disaster in the Bagh district where there were significant casualties: "99% of government and public buildings have been destroyed, together with 75% of all private housing. Gangrene is appearing in the clinics as people are arriving after almost two weeks with open wounds and Bagh town smells of rotting bodies."

ADRA-UK is now prioritising funding for the purpose of providing emergency

shelters. We would like to thank all those who have generously supported this appeal to date and encourage those who would like to help. ADRA-UK is accepting monetary donations through its special South Asia Earthquake Appeal.
